



The Catch-up Premium

The year 7 Literacy and numeracy catch up premium was introduced by the Government in April 2013.

It provides an additional £500 to support activities to help students joining secondary school with below national expectations levels in English or maths to catch up.

Governance of Catch-up Premium Spending

The governing body is responsible for approving the arrangements for the use of the catch up premium and for monitoring the impact of that spending.

Catch-up Premium Plan for 2018-2019

We expect to receive around £7,000 in catch-up premium in 2018-2019.

We have identified a cohort of 22 students whose performance is below KS2 expectations in maths and 16 students whose expectations were below KS2 expectations in English.

The money will be split across English and maths to support the progress of these students.

Catch-up premium money will support:

- Provision of reading lessons and the use of Accelerated Reader in Library sessions (£2,500) 1 hour every week
- Reading Buddies every week
- Introduction of a maths Accelerated Reader module to support the progress within maths (£2,500) 1 hour every week
- 1:1 or small group tuition for some targeted students in English and maths who started school with us having not met the expected standard. (£2,000)

Student progress will be monitored at assessment points to identify if the intervention are supporting the progress of students along with the data available from the 2 Accelerated Reader modules.

Students can access the Accelerated Reader programme at home to help support their progress outside of College.
