Payment and processes

At this stage we are looking for a firm expression of interest only. Once we have confirmed that residential trips will go ahead we will then contact parents and ask for a deposit and formal consent. You may choose to pay either by cheque or use the Wisepay internet payment facility on the College website. Where trips run, deposits are **non-returnable**, as we will commit funds to booking places. Once a place has been allocated, students and parents are expected to honour this. Should students wish to withdraw from a trip after places have been allocated, then we will expect all costs to be paid; the College cannot routinely refund payments, many of which are passed on to travel companies. If it is possible to fill a place which you have decided not to take then you may be

refunded some monies, but we do not refund deposits. Please note, any refunds will be returned to you by your original payment method.

Please can parents/carers respond to the electronic form that was sent out via email. Please let us know if you haven't received this. We are only looking for a firm expression of interest at this stage. Please ensure that the form is completed by **Friday 27 September 2019.**

In cases of genuine financial hardship (for example, a child receives free school meals), then College may be able to access alternative sources of finance to fund voluntary contributions. If we do not receive sufficient voluntary contributions to cover the full cost of the trip/event, then it may not be able to run and contributions will be refunded.

<p>The group meet at Manchester airport and travel to Costa Brava by plane. During the trip students will also travel by bus for a day trip to Barcelona. This year, we are planning to go with another school within the Chorus trust, Westfield School. The purpose of the visit is for students to experience life in a different country as well as to improve their Spanish speaking and listening skills.</p> <p>This trip will take place in February 2020 for a week during term time. We will be staying in small hotel near the beach. This will be a good residential experience for the students of the College and is aimed initially at students studying Spanish in Year 9.</p> <p>The aims of this visit are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Citizenship: to provide experience of and to promote positive attitudes towards another country, people and culture. • Language: to allow pupils to experience a foreign language, as well as to appreciate the advantages of learning such a language. • Personal Development: to enhance student's confidence in dealing with new situations, to encourage self-reliance and working as part of a team. • Residential: to provide students with experience of communal living with the considerations for others and responsibilities that this entails. • Social: to provide contact with Spanish people. • Enjoyment: to have an enjoyable, rewarding experience. <p>Visits planned in Spain <i>Day trip to Barcelona.</i> <i>Visit to La Boqueria Market, La Sagrada Familia, La Pedrera (Casa Milà), Camp Nou Stadium.</i> <i>Full day at PortAventura theme park.</i> <i>A visit to Parc Güell.</i></p> <p>At this stage, an approximate price guide is £500 per person based on 16 students. Enrichment Week 2020 (22 – 25 June)

All students will have the opportunity to take part in a walk to raise money for our local community, and in the afternoon we will run an inter-house sports competitions.

Font Bouldering Trip	Mr E Hill

<p>This is the first year running the trip to Fontainebleau, France. Climbing has taken place in 'Font' since the 19th Century and it is the largest and widely considered the best bouldering area in the world. The 14 places on the trip will be allocated first to students who regularly come to climbing club. We will journey by mini-bus from Hope Valley College to Les Pres Campsite in the center of the medieval village of Grez sur Loing, close to the town of Fontainebleau and less than 15 minute drive from many of the most popular bouldering crags. The campsite has a number facilities including hot showers, swimming pool, shops, café, patisserie and other sports facilities. Font is less than 1 hour from Paris on public transport, so we will be taking a rest day/wet weather day to visit Paris to see some of the city's most famous attractions such as, the Eiffel Tower and the Mona Lisa at Louvre museum. The aims of the trip are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Residential Experience: to provide an opportunity to develop their skills in living and working together as part of a team. The ability to co-operate closely with others underpins many aspects of the work of the National Curriculum.• Citizenship and language education: to allow pupils to experience a foreign language, as well as to appreciate the advantages of learning such a language amd to provide experience of and to promote positive attitudes towards another country, people and culture.• Outdoor awareness: Weather dependent the trip will be primarily include bouldering. With wet weather activities including cycling, walking and museums. The students will be camping for 5 nights and will have the opportunity to learn some basic camp craft skills including cooking on stoves. The camp should develop teamwork skills, increase awareness of the environment and prepare students for the Outdoor Education programme and the Duke of Edinburgh Award during in Year 10 as well as develop and further their passion for outdoor climbing and travel.

Y7 Activities Week

<p>This visit has been a successful part of the College's programme of residential experience for over 20 years. We will journey by coach to a 3-star campsite situated at the base of the Dune de Pyla, with an overnight break at Camping Chantepie, a 4-star campsite in the Loire Valley. Facilities at both campsites are excellent and include: hot showers, swimming pool, shop, cafe and other sports facilities.</p> <p>Students are closely involved in the planning of the visit, the aims of which are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Residential Experience: to provide an opportunity to develop their skills in living and working together as part of a team. The ability to co-operate closely with others underpins many aspects of the work of the National Curriculum. Students are involved both before and during the visit in deciding ground rules and in confronting issues which are raised. • Leisure Education and Economic Awareness: to involve students in the planning and budgeting of the visit. Discussion groups and working sessions are held throughout the period leading up to the visit for students to plan details of the visit themselves. Students will have to plan, prepare and cook their own meals and put up their own tents. • Language: this is a secondary aim of this visit, but nonetheless an important element of the package. Students develop self-reliance in dealing with situations involving the language. <p>Despite the nature of the visit, where students take responsibility for the planning and running of the activities, supervision is ensured by a high ratio of Hope Valley College staff who accompany the students throughout the visit. Students are expected to have an interest in, or active enjoyment of camping, as well as showing a high level of personal initiative and responsibility.</p> <p>This is a physically demanding trip and students wishing to take part are encouraged to talk to previous participants in order to gain a 'consumer perspective' and we will be pleased to show photographs of previous visits. As this is a camping holiday, students need to be "open-minded" when it comes to food, etc. Fussiness does not tend to go hand in hand with camping! Furthermore, regular meetings are held during lunchtimes, and students will need to attend these meetings in order to go on the trip. Failure to do so may result in a student being removed from the trip.</p> <p>This visit is often oversubscribed. This is part of the Y9 programme for Activities week and is covered in the £60.00 (approx.) cost for the week.	Activities Week 2020
<p>For the last eight years we have run a very successful residential adventurous camping experience for Year 9 students during Activities Week. It is part of our pledge to provide a residential experience for all students, and is an important part of preparing students for the KS4 core Outdoor Education programme.</p> <p>Your son or daughter will be allocated a place on this camp unless they are involved in an alternative residential experience during Activities Week.</p> <p>The camp will include a multi activity day where students can try rock climbing, caving or weaselling. The students will be camping for two nights and will have the opportunity to learn some basic camp craft skills including cooking on stoves. The camp should develop decision-making and teamwork skills, increase awareness of the environment and prepare students for the Outdoor Education programme in Year 10. The overall aim of the camp is to enthuse the students about the benefits of outdoor activities and encourage them to take part in schemes such as the Duke of Edinburgh Award during Year 10.</p>

<p>We will be staying in the Jugendgasteparadies bachlehen youth hostel in Radstadt Austria, for one week, including 6 days skiing and all evening activities. The 2022 trip cost will depend on the economic climate when we secure the places with PGL. (The cost for 2020 is £950). It will be payable in four parts, but we are not asking for a deposit until <u>September 2020.</u></p> <p>NB: This trip is very often oversubscribed and we are limited to numbers due to the legislation surrounding it.
